

Collective damage action by European hotels against Booking.com

Brussels, 28 May 2025

Today, HOTREC – the Association of Hotels, Restaurants & Cafés in Europe – announces the launch of a pan-European <u>collective action against Booking.com</u>. The initiative is supported by more than 25 national hotel associations across Europe, and it takes collective private competition enforcement to the next level. Hoteliers across Europe will join forces to send a strong message to the dominant online booking portal: they will no longer accept the pattern of unfair trading practices. All European hotels which are/were listed on the Booking.com platform between 2004 and 2024 are eligible and invited to participate in this collective action, under which the participating hotels will jointly seek compensation from Booking.com for excessive commissions charged during the relevant timeframe.

Alexandros Vassilikos, President of HOTREC, stated: *"European hoteliers have long endured unfair conditions and inflated costs. Now is the time to stand together and seek redress. This collective action sends a strong message: abusive practices in the digital marketplace will not go unchallenged."*

This legal action follows the judgment by the European Court of Justice (ECJ) of 19 September 2024 (case C-264/23), in which the ECJ confirmed that the parity clauses used by Booking.com violated European competition law.
